COMMUNICATION SKILLS

- Speak clearly with your child. Model good speech.
- Read a picture book with your child daily. This will enhance vocabulary and develop a love for books at an early age.
- Sing simple songs, and say nursery rhymes. This helps your child learn the rhythm of speech.
- Place familiar objects in a box. Have your child take one out and tell you it's
 name and how to use it. "This is my ball. I bounce it. I play with it."
- Add on to what your toddler says. When your child says, "Mama," say, "Here is Mama. Mama loves you. Where is baby? Here is baby."
- Ask questions that include a choice. "Do you want an apple or an orange?" "Do you want to wear your red shirt or your blue shirt?"

SOCIAL SKILLS

- Visit the local fruit or vegetable market with your child.
- Pretend play "Meal time". Let your toddler pass food at the table to other members and learn golden words "Please" and "Thank you".









SELF MANAGEMENT SKILLS

- Give 2-3 water containers to your little one. Let him/her transfer water from one container to the other. This will enhance your child's motor skills..
- Create a zigzag on the floor. Let your child walk/crawl and balance on it.
- Let your child hit targets with a ball.
- Help your child mould potter's clay (chikni mitti) or plain flour (atta) and be creative.

RESEARCH SKILLS

- Give some things to your child. Let him/her throw them in the water to see what floats/sinks.
- Watch the stars and clouds. If possible use a pair of binoculars.
- Let your child feed the birds and observe them eat.
- Visit the park. Collect some fallen leaves and let your child observe the differences.

Last but not the least, try to keep your child away from TV, mobile phones, computers and other electronic gadgets; they have their whole life for that.
